IQCC (N-16): sc-243095



The Power to Question

BACKGROUND

Widely distributed in nature, the IQ domain forms an amphiphilic seven-turn α -helix capable of binding calmodulin in a Ca^2+-independent manner. The level of intracellular calcium is tightly regulated in all eukaryotic cells. A modest increase in this level can result in a myriad of physiological responses, most of which are mediated by calmodulin (CaM), the universal calcium sensor. IQCC (IQ motif containing C) is a 466 amino acid protein that contains one IQ domain. Existing as two alternatively spliced isoforms, IQCC is encoded by a gene located on human chromosome 1p35.1. Human chromosome 1 is the largest human chromosome spanning about 260 million base pairs and making up 8% of the human genome. There are about 3,000 genes on chromosome 1, and considering the great number of genes there are also a large number of diseases associated with chromosome 1, including Hutchinson-Gilford progeria, Parkinsons, Gaucher disease and Usher syndrome.

Genetic locus: IQCC (human) mapping to 1p35.1.

SOURCE

IQCC (N-16) is an affinity purified goat polyclonal antibody raised against a peptide mapping near the N-terminus of IQCC of human origin.

PRODUCT

Each vial contains 200 μg IgG in 1.0 ml of PBS with <0.1% sodium azide and 0.1% gelatin.

Blocking peptide available for competition studies, sc-243095 P, (100 μ g peptide in 0.5 ml PBS containing < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.2% BSA).

APPLICATIONS

IQCC (N-16) is recommended for detection of IQCC of human origin by Western Blotting (starting dilution 1:200, dilution range 1:100-1:1000), immunofluorescence (starting dilution 1:50, dilution range 1:50-1:500) and solid phase ELISA (starting dilution 1:30, dilution range 1:30-1:3000).

Suitable for use as control antibody for IQCC siRNA (h): sc-78772, IQCC shRNA Plasmid (h): sc-78772-SH and IQCC shRNA (h) Lentiviral Particles: sc-78772-V.

Molecular Weight of IQCC isoforms: 53/27 kDa.
