# ROGDI (E-16): sc-244037



The Power to Question

## BACKGROUND

ROGDI is a 287 amino acid leucine zipper domain protein and homolog of rodgi of *Drosophila melanogaster* origin. Conserved in canine, bovine, mouse, rat and chicken, ROGDI is encoded by a gene located on human chromosome 16, which encodes over 900 genes and comprises nearly 3% of human cellular DNA. The GAN gene is located on chromosome 16 and, with mutation, may lead to giant axonal neuropathy, a nervous system disorder characterized by increasing malfunction with growth. The rare disorder Rubinstein-Taybi syndrome is also associated with chromosome 16 through the CREBBP gene, which encodes a critical CREB binding protein. Crohn's disease is a gastrointestinal inflammatory condition associated with chromosome 16 through the NOD2 gene. An association with systemic lupus erythematosis and a number of other autoimmune disorders with the pericentromeric region of chromosome 16 has led to the identification of SLC5A11 as a potential autoimmune modifier.

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## CHROMOSOMAL LOCATION

Genetic locus: ROGDI (human) mapping to 16p13.3; Rogdi (mouse) mapping to 16 A1.

#### SOURCE

ROGDI (E-16) is an affinity purified goat polyclonal antibody raised against a peptide mapping within an internal region of ROGDI of human origin.

## PRODUCT

Each vial contains 200  $\mu g$  lgG in 1.0 ml of PBS with < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.1% gelatin.

Blocking peptide available for competition studies, sc-244037 P, (100  $\mu g$  peptide in 0.5 ml PBS containing < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.2% BSA).

## **APPLICATIONS**

ROGDI (E-16) is recommended for detection of ROGDI of mouse, rat and human origin by Western Blotting (starting dilution 1:200, dilution range 1:100-1:1000), immunofluorescence (starting dilution 1:50, dilution range 1:50-1:500) and solid phase ELISA (starting dilution 1:30, dilution range 1:30-1:3000).

ROGDI (E-16) is also recommended for detection of ROGDI in additional species, including bovine and porcine.
