Cyanazine (HYB269-01): sc-57694

BACKGROUND

Cyanazine is a member of the s-triazine chemical family and is used as an herbicide for pre- and post-emergent to control annual grasses and broadleaf weeds. The roots of the affected plants absorb Cyanazine, which is then translocated into the leaves where it functions by inhibiting photosynthesis. Cyanazine is an odorless, white, crystalline solid that is incompatible with metals and has a molecular weight of 240.73 g/mol. Cyanazine is quickly degraded in many soil types mainly due to the action of microbes, but it can withstand both hydrolysis and photolysis. A wide range of birth defects are caused by Cyanazine, including incomplete bone development, cleft palates, abnormalities in diaphragm development and changes in the brain. Other effects of Cyanazine in animals include the depression of the central nervous system, increased liver weights and decreased body weight gain.
