BACKGROUND

Salmonella bacteria are the most frequently reported cause of foodborne illness. Salmonella is a genus composed of rod-shaped, highly mobile Gram-negative bacterium. This non spore-forming genus includes over 2,000 serotypes of Salmonella bacteria, organized into five different serogroups: Salmonella A, B, C, D and E. A widespread occurrence of Salmonella in animals, chiefly in swine and poultry, and also environmental sources, including water, soil, insects, kitchen surfaces, factory surfaces, raw meats and animal feces, causes Salmonellosis. Several species are mildly pathogenic, producing slight gastroenteritis, while others generate a case of serious and often fatal food poisoning. Symptoms are reminiscent of the flu and may include myalgia, fever, lethargy, cough, gastrointestinal discomfort and sore throat. There is no difference in taste, smell or appearance in food infected with the bacteria. The bacteria persist in the intestinal tracts of infected animals and humans.

Salmonella (6321) is a mouse monoclonal antibody raised against a *Salmonella* cell preparation.

PRODUCT

Each vial contains 100 $\mu g \; lg G_{2a}$ in 1.0 ml of PBS with < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.1% gelatin.

APPLICATIONS

Salmonella (6321) is recommended for detection of flagellum protein present in most *Salmonella* species by solid phase ELISA (starting dilution 1:30, dilution range 1:30-1:3000).

STORAGE

Store at 4° C, **DO NOT FREEZE**. Stable for one year from the date of shipment. Non-hazardous. No MSDS required.
