BACKGROUND

Cell cycle progression is controlled at a point late in G1 designated Start. Passage through Start requires the activity of the cyclin-dependent protein kinase Cdc28. Transition from G1 to S phase requires the association of Cdc28 with members of the G1 cyclin family, including Cln1, Cln2 and Cln3 (also designated Daf1 or Whi1). The G2 to M phase requires the M phase cyclins, Clb1 (also designated Scb1) and Clb2, as well as the G2 cyclins, Clb3 and Clb4. The S phase cyclins Clb5 and Clb6 coordinate DNA replication with cytokinesis. Expression of the cyclins is controlled by UBC9 and Cdc34 (also designated Ubc3 or Dna6) via ubiquitin-mediated proteolysis.

Cln2 (yC-19) is recommended for detection of Cln2 of *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* origin by Western Blotting (starting dilution 1:200, dilution range 1:100-1:1000) and solid phase ELISA (starting dilution 1:30, dilution range 1:30-1:3000).
