BACKGROUND

The extensive family of COL gene products (collagens) is composed of several chain types, including fibril-forming interstitial collagens (types I, II, III and V) and basement membrane collagens (type IV), each type containing multiple isoforms. Collagens are fibrous, extracellular matrix proteins with high tensile strength and are the major components of connective tissue, such as tendons and cartilage. All collagens contain a triple helix domain and frequently show lateral self-association in order to form complex connective tissues. Several collagens also play a role in cell adhesion, important for maintaining normal tissue architecture and function.

CHROMOSOMAL LOCATION

Genetic locus: COL22A1 (human) mapping to 8q24.23; Col22a1 (mouse) mapping to 15 D3.

SOURCE

COL22A1 (N-17) is an affinity purified goat polyclonal antibody raised against a peptide mapping near the N-terminus of Collagen Type XXII of human origin.

PRODUCT

Each vial contains 200 μg IgG in 1.0 ml of PBS with < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.1% gelatin.

Blocking peptide available for competition studies, sc-87647 P, (100 μ g peptide in 0.5 ml PBS containing < 0.1% sodium azide and 0.2% BSA).

STORAGE

Store at 4° C, **DO NOT FREEZE**. Stable for one year from the date of shipment. Non-hazardous. No MSDS required.

APPLICATIONS

COL22A1 (N-17) is recommended for detection of Collagen Type XXII of mouse, rat and human origin by Western Blotting (starting dilution 1:200, dilution range 1:100-1:1000), immunoprecipitation [1-2 µg per 100-500 µg of total protein (1 ml of cell lysate)], immunofluorescence (starting dilution 1:50, dilution range 1:50-1:500) and solid phase ELISA (starting dilution 1:30, dilution range 1:30-1:3000).

COL22A1 (N-17) is also recommended for detection of Collagen Type XXII in additional species, including canine and bovine.

Suitable for use as control antibody for COL22A1 siRNA (h): sc-77503, COL22A1 siRNA (m): sc-142463, COL22A1 shRNA Plasmid (h): sc-77503-SH, COL22A1 shRNA Plasmid (m): sc-142463-SH, COL22A1 shRNA (h) Lentiviral Particles: sc-77503-V and COL22A1 shRNA (m) Lentiviral Particles: sc-142463-V.


