ZNF83 siRNA (h): sc-97709



The Power to Question

BACKGROUND

Zinc-finger proteins contain DNA-binding domains and have a wide variety of functions, most of which encompass some form of transcriptional activation or repression. The majority of zinc-finger proteins contain a Krüppel-type DNA binding domain and a KRAB domain, which is thought to interact with KAP1, thereby recruiting histone modifying proteins. ZNF83 (zinc finger protein 83), also known as zinc finger protein 816B or zinc finger protein HPF1, is a 516 amino acid nuclear protein that may be involved in transcriptional regulation. Belonging to the Krüppel C_2H_2 -type zinc-finger protein family, ZNF83 contains $15 \ C_2H_2$ -type zinc fingers. The gene encoding ZNF83 maps to human chromosome 19, which consists of over 63 million bases, houses approximately 1,400 genes and is recognized for having the greatest gene density of the human chromosomes. It is the genetic home for a number of immunoglobulin (lg) superfamily members, including the killer cell and leukocyte lg-like receptors, a number of ICAMs, the CEACAM and PSG families, and Fc receptors (FcRs). ZNF83 exists as two alternatively spliced isoforms.

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CHROMOSOMAL LOCATION

Genetic locus: ZNF83 (human) mapping to 19q13.41.

PRODUCT

ZNF83 siRNA (h) is a pool of 3 target-specific 19-25 nt siRNAs designed to knock down gene expression. Each vial contains 3.3 nmol of lyophilized siRNA, sufficient for a 10 μ M solution once resuspended using protocol below. Suitable for 50-100 transfections. Also see ZNF83 shRNA Plasmid (h): sc-97709-SH and ZNF83 shRNA (h) Lentiviral Particles: sc-97709-V as alternate gene silencing products.

For independent verification of ZNF83 (h) gene silencing results, we also provide the individual siRNA duplex components. Each is available as 3.3 nmol of lyophilized siRNA. These include: sc-97709A, sc-97709B and sc-97709C.

STORAGE AND RESUSPENSION

Store lyophilized siRNA duplex at -20° C with desiccant. Stable for at least one year from the date of shipment. Once resuspended, store at -20° C, avoid contact with RNAses and repeated freeze thaw cycles.

Resuspend lyophilized siRNA duplex in 330 μ l of the RNAse-free water provided. Resuspension of the siRNA duplex in 330 μ l of RNAse-free water makes a 10 μ M solution in a 10 μ M Tris-HCl, pH 8.0, 20 mM NaCl, 1 mM EDTA buffered solution.

APPLICATIONS

ZNF83 siRNA (h) is recommended for the inhibition of ZNF83 expression in human cells.

SUPPORT REAGENTS

For optimal siRNA transfection efficiency, Santa Cruz Biotechnology's siRNA Transfection Reagent: sc-29528 (0.3 ml), siRNA Transfection Medium: sc-36868 (20 ml) and siRNA Dilution Buffer: sc-29527 (1.5 ml) are recommended. Control siRNAs or Fluorescein Conjugated Control siRNAs are available as 10 μ M in 66 μ l. Each contain a scrambled sequence that will not lead to the specific degradation of any known cellular mRNA. Fluorescein Conjugated Control siRNAs include: sc-36869, sc-44239, sc-44240 and sc-44241. Control siRNAs include: sc-37007, sc-44230, sc-44231, sc-44232, sc-44233, sc-44234, sc-44235, sc-44236, sc-44237 and sc-44238.

RT-PCR REAGENTS

Semi-quantitative RT-PCR may be performed to monitor ZNF83 gene expression knockdown using RT-PCR Primer: ZNF83 (h)-PR: sc-97709-PR (20 μ I). Annealing temperature for the primers should be 55-60° C and the extension temperature should be 68-72° C.
