

TRIM43 siRNA (h): sc-94800

BACKGROUND

The tripartite motif (TRIM) family of proteins are characterized by a conserved TRIM domain that includes a coiled-coil region, a B box-type zinc finger, one RING finger and three zinc-binding domains. TRIM proteins are involved in a wide variety of cellular processes such as cell development, proliferation, differentiation, oncogenesis and apoptosis. Many TRIM proteins are induced by type I and type II interferons, making them crucial for development of pathogen-resistance. TRIM43 (tripartite motif-containing protein 43) is a 446 amino acid protein that contains a variety of domains that are characteristic to TRIM proteins, including a RING-type zinc finger, a B box-type zinc finger and a B30.2/SPRY domain. In mice, TRIM43 expression is restricted to the preimplantation stages, with levels peaking at the 8-cell to morula stage.

CHROMOSOMAL LOCATION

Genetic locus: TRIM43 (human) mapping to 2q11.1.

PRODUCT

TRIM43 siRNA (h) is a target-specific 19-25 nt siRNA designed to knock down gene expression. Each vial contains 3.3 nmol of lyophilized siRNA, sufficient for a 10 μ M solution once resuspended using protocol below. Suitable for 50-100 transfections. Also see TRIM43 shRNA Plasmid (h): sc-94800-SH and TRIM43 shRNA (h) Lentiviral Particles: sc-94800-V as alternate gene silencing products.

STORAGE AND RESUSPENSION

Store lyophilized siRNA duplex at -20° C with desiccant. Stable for at least one year from the date of shipment. Once resuspended, store at -20° C, avoid contact with RNases and repeated freeze thaw cycles.

Resuspend lyophilized siRNA duplex in 330 μ l of the RNase-free water provided. Resuspension of the siRNA duplex in 330 μ l of RNase-free water makes a 10 μ M solution in a 10 μ M Tris-HCl, pH 8.0, 20 mM NaCl, 1 mM EDTA buffered solution.

APPLICATIONS

TRIM43 siRNA (h) is recommended for the inhibition of TRIM43 expression in human cells.

SUPPORT REAGENTS

For optimal siRNA transfection efficiency, Santa Cruz Biotechnology's siRNA Transfection Reagent: sc-29528 (0.3 ml), siRNA Transfection Medium: sc-36868 (20 ml) and siRNA Dilution Buffer: sc-29527 (1.5 ml) are recommended. Control siRNAs or Fluorescein Conjugated Control siRNAs are available as 10 μ M in 66 μ l. Each contain a scrambled sequence that will not lead to the specific degradation of any known cellular mRNA. Fluorescein Conjugated Control siRNAs include: sc-36869, sc-44239, sc-44240 and sc-44241. Control siRNAs include: sc-37007, sc-44230, sc-44231, sc-44232, sc-44233, sc-44234, sc-44235, sc-44236, sc-44237 and sc-44238.

RT-PCR REAGENTS

Semi-quantitative RT-PCR may be performed to monitor TRIM43 gene expression knockdown using RT-PCR Primer: TRIM43 (h)-PR: sc-94800-PR (20 μ l). Annealing temperature for the primers should be 55-60° C and the extension temperature should be 68-72° C.
